Lake News: Great progress was made on Lake Clean Up Day on November 5th.

Honeysuckle stumps have been treated, invasive trees removed and the litter cleaned up. We are now a big step closer to our goal of protecting and preserving the dam, and therefore the entire Lake. The next steps will be to revegetate the slope and repair and protect the upslope of the dam itself.
